As many of you know from the Old and New testament, the Heavenly Father has not really called the government to care for the poor. The Heavenly Father has not called the government to speak out for those who can't speak for themselves. In the Christianity court yard the Bible always gives



the responsibility to the Shepherd to care for the sheep. It is the Shepherd's job is to feed and take care of the sheep, not the sheep's job to take care of the Shepherd.

We read in Deuteronomy 15 7-11, "If anyone is poor among your fellow Israelites in any of the towns of the land the LORD your God is giving you, do not be hardhearted or tightfisted toward them. ⁸ Rather, be openhanded and freely lend them whatever they need. ⁹ Be careful not to harbor this wicked thought: "The seventh year, the year for canceling debts, is near," so that you do not show ill will toward the needy among your fellow Israelites and give them nothing. They may then appeal to the LORD against you, and you will be found guilty of sin. ¹⁰ Give generously to them and do so without a grudging heart; then because of this the LORD your God will bless you in all your work and in everything you put your hand to. ¹¹ There will always be poor people in the land. Therefore I command you to be openhanded toward your fellow Israelites who are poor and needy in your land."

Remember when Jesus asked Peter 3 questions? Jesus did not ask the sheep, Do you love me? but He asked Peter, "Do you love me?" Jesus did not ask the sheep to feed and take care of Peter. Jesus asked Peter to take care of them.

John 21:15-17 "When they had finished eating, Jesus said to Simon Peter, "Simon son of John, do you love me more than these?" He answered, "Yes, Lord, you know that I love you." Jesus said, "Feed my lambs."

¹⁶Again Jesus said, "Simon son of John, do you love me?" "Yes, Lord," he said, "you know that I love you." Jesus said, "Take care of my sheep."

¹⁷The third time he said to him, "Simon son of John, do you love me?" Peter was hurt because Jesus asked him the third time, "Do you love me?" He said, "Lord, you know all things; you know that I love you." Jesus said, "Feed my sheep."

We read in Luke 3:11 "John answered, "Anyone who has two shirts should share with the one who has none, and anyone who has food should do the same."
